









Prickly Pear had no friends. He was very lonely.








He decided to make friends with other trees.
















Then Prickly Pear went to Banana Tree.


"Not friends, no way," said Banana Tree.






Prickly Pear asked Mango Tree, then Guava Tree.

"We are always watered, while you are used to thirst and dust," Pawpaw Tree continued.




"But I feel sorry for you as you are so lonely. So I will be friends with you. But don't prick me!"


Pawpaw Tree was hurt and offended.









Prickly Pear was terribly sad. But he would not give up! He decided to look somewhere else.
