They prefer to sneak into the house and taste the food that Mrs Mlambo cooks.



















One day, the two naughty mice sneaked into the house and hid in the cupboard.

"Eee, eee!" they said, and started chewing her handbag.






Mrs Mlambo heard the noise and came to her room with her big broom.
