We hope these templates will be a useful tool for you as you design children's books.

What You'll Need to Know to Use the Templates

These templates were designed using Adobe InDesign software. To use the templates, you will need the InDesign application. You can find a free seven-day trial of Adobe InDesign here: https://www.adobe.com/products/indesign/free-trial-download.html

You will also need to have working knowledge of the InDesign software. To brush up on your InDesign skills, there are many tutorials on the Adobe website: https://creativecloud.adobe.com/cc/learn/app/indesign
You can also find many tutorials and answers to questions by searching Google.

The InDesign skills you will need include:

- Creating text boxes, selecting and sizing typography
- Creating image boxes and importing images
- Creating color palettes
- Knowledge of Parent Pages
- Knowledge of Layers
- Knowledge of Character Styles
- Some skills in type manipulation for book cover
- Basic understanding of preparing files for offset printing

There are five First Book Templates to choose from, each using a different shape motif throughout the pages. The choices are as follows:




Choose which template you would like to use for your book. **Please use one shape motif only per book,** in order to keep the design simple and harmonious.

Using Parent Pages

There is a full library of parent pages to help you create interesting layouts. Experiment with using different right and left page combinations. Shape motifs can be removed to create simple page layouts. (See examples on following pages).

Important Note: When parent pages are opened, all items on the pages will be **locked**. To **unlock** the items, highlight the pages you would like to unlock in the Pages panel, and choose "Override All Parent Page Items" from the list. Now all items on the pages will be unlocked.





Naming Your InDesign Files and Assets

InDesign Files

Please name your files using a clear system, such as the following:

COUNTRY NAME ABBREVIATION_BOOK TITLE_language(s)

For example:

SN WILD ANIMALS fra

If the book is in more than one language:

SN_WILD ANIMALS_fra_wol

Country name abbreviations: please use two letter international country codes. International country codes can be found here: https://www.nationsonline.org/oneworld/country_code_list.htm

Language abbreviations: please use ISO 639-3 codes to specify the language(s). ISO codes can be found here: https://iso639-3.sil.org/code_tables/639/data

Illustration Files and Other Assets


Illustrations should be named as follows:

book title_illustration #

For example:

wild animals_1, wild animals_2, etc.

Other assets, such as logos, author photos, etc., can be named accordingly: company logo, author photo 1, author photo, etc.



Designing the Book Cover

A good book cover must be eye-catching and inviting. This can be acheived by using bright colors, enticing illustrations and fun typography to capture the spirit of the content. For young readers, be certain the cover title is large and legible.

Choose the strongest illustration from the book interior to use as your cover, or use the illustration that was created for the cover. You can also add some smaller illustrations to make your cover more interesting, as shown in the sample on the facing page.

The cover should include the **author's name** and the **illustrator's name**. If the text was translated, please include the **translator's name** as well.

Designer Tip: Even though the cover is the first part of your book, try designing it after the interior pages are completed. By designing the interior pages first, you will become familiar with the story and the illustrations. You'll have mastered the use of the color palette and shape motifs, and you will have created the mood and spirit of the book. With the interior pages completed, the cover will be fun and easy to design.

Choosing a Cover Font

Choose a font that harmonizes with your text font and best reflects the spirit of the text and illustrations. Get creative by using drop shadows, outlines, multiple colors, etc. Try putting your title on a curve, or changing the sizes of words and letters. The title treatment is a great way to create excitement.

Creating the Title Page

The title page is the first page of the book—a bridge between the cover and the story—setting the stage for the excitement to follow. The title page should be similar to the cover, but the title, illustrations, author, illustrator and translator names are smaller.


Below is an example of a title page.



Copyright Information on the Inside Front Cover

Use the "Inside Front Cover" parent page for copyright information. The text for your inside front cover will be delivered by the publisher.


The inside front cover may include a logo, address, and website link of the copyright owner. Publishers may also include logos of funders, a mission statement, or a dedication, as well as the names of the editor, designer, printer, or others involved in the creation of the book. Below is an example of a title page.



Using the Parent Page Templates to Design Your Book


Review the **parent pages**, and explore the page styles and spread combinations you can create. Following are some examples of how the templates can be used. The following examples use the "First Book Templates_Starbursts" template. The parent page name is listed below the sample spreads.

Note: The margin on all pages is set at 9.5mm, and is indicated on the template. Typography should never extend beyond the margin.




Left page: No Starburst 1

Right page: Starburst_9. Note: When using this template, **please use only four shapes per page**, as shown above, to avoid visual clutter.




Left page: No Starburst_1 Right page: No Starburst_1




Left page: No Starburst_1, plus a starburst shape for spot illustration.



Choosing a Font Family

The recommended font families for the First Book Templates are **Andika**, **Quicksand** and **Balsamiq**. Choose one font family only per book, to create a harmonious design. These fonts can be downloaded from https://fonts.google.com



Font Sizes and Color


The font sizes shown in the pages below are recommended font sizes for each of the parent template types.

Use only **black type**, on the interior pages. Colored type may be used on the covers.



1 image per page grid: font size 60 points


6 image per page grid: font size 30 points



4 images per page grid: font size 40 points


2 images per page grid: 40 points


Interior Pages Layout Samples for Inspiration













Using Layers for Page Numbers

You may or may not choose to use page numbers on the pages of your book. If you would like to use page numbers, turn on the layer that matches your Font Family.




If you do not want to use page numbers, deselect all of the Page Numbers layers.




If you do want to use page numbers, select the Page Number layer that matches your font. In the example above, the designer is using Quicksand, and has elected to use page numbers.

Using Layers for Text and Multiple Languages

The text in your book should be on a separate layer—not on the same layer as the illustrations. This allows you to add additional language versions of your book on additional layers, in one InDesign document.



If your book will be published in only one language, you will need only one text layer, as shown above. Your text layers should be named with the language you are using.




If your book will be published in several languages, create a layer for each language, and name them accordingly. You can hide the languages you don't want to see by deselecting the "eye" icon for that layer. In the example above, the designer has turned off the French Text layer, and is working on the Wolof Text layer.

Creating a Color Palette

A good color palette is key to the spirit and appeal of your book. To create a harmoniuos design, limit your color scheme to a maximum of six colors.

To create your color palette, choose your colors based on your illustrations. In the example below, the first four colors can be found in the illustrations. These will be the primary colors of your palette.

The second two colors may not be found in the illustrations at all, or used only minimally. They compliment the colors in the illustration, but also provide contrast. These will be the secondary colors of your palette.






Designer Tip: Experiment with the color palette to see if the colors look pleasing together. Will they work well as background colors and shapes for the illustrations?

Inside Back Cover with Author and Illustrator Biography

Use the "Inside Back Cover" parent page template for the author and illustrator photos and biographies. The specific text will be delivered by the publisher.



Back Cover Book Synopsis

The back cover is an ideal spot for an illustration or collage and a short synopsis of the book, as shown in the example below.

The 100 First Children's Books Templates

The 100 First Children's Books guideline offers recommendations for "first collection" of children's literature. It is intended for Read@Home and other early reading programs involved in the development and/or selection of books to support children's pre-reading and early reading skills.

To support the development of the books suggested in the guideline, Read@Home has also created a series of InDesign templates for designers. Each template contains two parts:

- An InDesign Master Template in the proper trim size, with pre-created parent pages for ease of use.
- A PDF Users' Guide to aid designers working with the templates.

The following templates are available:

First Book Template

• These are square books. The square size mimics the format of most board books for this age group.

Picturebook Template

- This template is fairly large, in order to give space for interesting images and engaging design.
- This template can be used for fiction or nonfiction.
- It is available in both portrait and landscape trims.

Leveled Reader - Fiction Template

- This template is available only in portrait trim, and at a smaller size than a picturebook.
- The size is standard for leveled readers in the children's book industry.

Leveled Reader - Nonfiction Template

This template includes nonfiction features such as a table of contents, captions, sidebars, and bibliographies.

Comic Template

- This template includes panel layouts for sequential storytelling.
- Its user guide also includes more detailed information about developing comic books, as their process is more complex than standard narrative books.

Important Notes

All links connect to the <u>Early Literacy Resource Network</u>. You can also search "100 First Children's Books" on the site to find a webpage containing all the relevant resources.

The trim sizes for these templates were selected by Blue Tree Group.

- They are based on cost-effectiveness for offset print runs of 10k+, on coated paper for the brightest color reproduction.
- Print runs between 2500 and 10k are generally printed in a sheet machine with no cut-off feed, thus trim size also plays a minor role in cost.
- Print runs under 2500 are generally most affordable when printed digitally on-demand, thus trim size is a less critical cost factor.
